Data Collection Plan



What is it and how can it help me?

This plan organizes measures for a quality improvement effort. It helps you choose a balanced set of measures (including process, outcome, and balancing) to indicate progress toward an aim or goal.

How to use this tool:

Insert your aim statement and all measures for a single QI effort.

Example:

AIM STATEMENT: Increase the % of female patients 15-24 years old screened for chlamydia during a pregnancy-test-only (PTO) visit from 25% on July 1, to 75% by December 31. (Patients screened for chlamydia / Female patients seen for PTO visit)
